Dan Rodricks is a long-time columnist for The Baltimore Sun and a former local radio and television host who has won several national and regional journalism awards over a reporting, writing and broadcast career spanning five decades.

Will Schwarz is a Baltimorebased independent television
producer, writer and director

with over 30 years of experience creating original non-fiction programs for broadcast, government and corporate clients. He has received Emmy and Telly awards and worked on high-profile broadcasts, including the Olympics. He is proud of helping create the acclaimed Rodricks for Breakfast show as its first producer. Will is founder and president of the Maryland Lynching Memorial Project, a 501(c)(3) that advances racial reconciliation in the state by documenting the history of racial terror lynchings, advocating for public acknowledgment of these murders and working to honor and dignify the lives of the victims. Baltimore. You Have No Idea (BYHNI) is his debut as director of theatre.



Mat Lane — Music Director Mathew Lane has worked for Friends School of Baltimore since 2001, managing the after-school

music program and accompanying all choral concerts and musical theatre shows in the Middle and Upper Schools. He is also Director of Music at the St. Jude Shrine in Baltimore. He has taught piano, class piano and musicianship at Goucher College and Notre Dame of Maryland University.

He has performed extensively with the Maryland State Boychoir and was Music Director for Young Actors Theatre in Owings Mills, directing Lin Manuel-Miranda's "In the Heights," among other productions. Other credits include pit piano for the Baltimore Municipal Opera's production of Bizet's Carmen, as well as Amahl and the Night Visitors and Mozart's The Magic Flute, also at Municipal. Mat lives in Towson with his wife, soprano Rebecca Rossello, and their two children, Ana and Nicholas.



Jim Bigwood

Show business runs in Jim's DNA. His grand aunt Irene was a circus lion tamer in the late 19th century. When

he trod the stage as Aladdin in 4th grade, he was bitten by the bug and hooked when the audience laughed at his lines. A heralded audio engineer, Jim was recruited to play radio comic characters for the Jones & West Show on WBAL AM and for Courduff and Lopez on 98 Rock. In the early 1990s he was the announcer for Dan Rodricks' nightly WBAL radio show. In the 1980's, Jim did commercial voice-overs in Baltimore and Washington. He also played an uncredited police officer in Robert Townsend's movie Meteor Man; Jim was paid handsomely to shave off his mustache for the part. These days Jim is seen periodically on Maryland Public Television as a pledge drive host.



John Dignam

John is thrilled to appear again in this revival of BYHNI. He has worked happily in Baltimore theatre

since his retirement from federal service eight years ago with many local groups,

With a passion for creative storytelling, he can be found with his gear at many of the area's biggest stories and has turned his camera on NFL games, the
